Thanks to his skilled and affectionate caregivers, he was able to maintain a high quality of life as he transitioned through the stages of the disease.

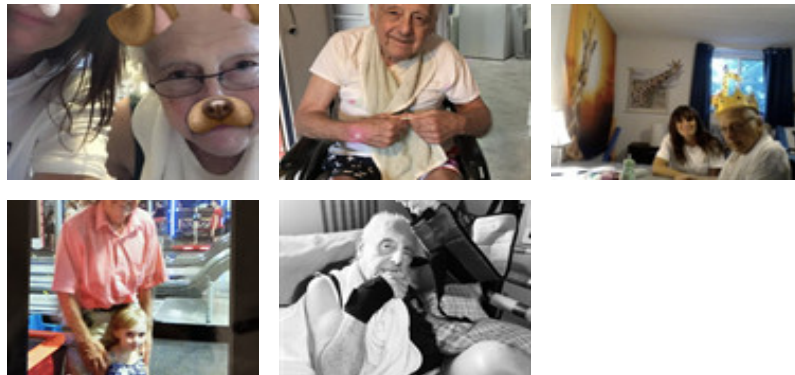
