Domenico "Dom" A. Sciubba, age 91, passed away on December 28, 2025. He was born on August 19, 1934, in Upper Darby, to the late Consalvo and Agnes (D'Alessandro) Sciubba.

Dom grew up in East Lansdowne and was a graduate of Lansdowne High School and Drexel University. He proudly served his country in the United States Army Corp of Engineers before beginning a long and successful sales career with Westinghouse until his retirement. He remained active with his colleagues as a member of the Westinghouse Retirees 707 Club.

A longtime resident of Springfield, Dom was deeply involved in his community. He dedicated many years to coaching Springfield AA Baseball, teaching the sport that he loved. He had many opinions he was glad to share coupled with an incredible sense of humor. He was grounded in family and faith and will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.
