Donny took his shoe off so fast and looked at his toes than he ran home, and I chased after him when we got to his house, he went into his downstairs refrigerator and grabbed his dad's pony bottles of Rolling Rock beer and we sat and drank some of his dad's beer. The mower blade never touched his foot that was when Donny and I became very close friends.

Donny and I did a lot together after that, we would ride bikes together, then we started to ride minibikes together. We would hitchhike all over town. We both had gotten motorcycles and one day we rode to Atlantic City played at the casino and we fell asleep on the beach and woke up in the afternoon I was burnt, and Donny just got a better tan. For me that was a long ride home.

I have so many great memories of things Donny and I did together I miss his late-night phone calls and most of all I miss my friend. For those who knew Donny he was a great person to be around, and he will be missed.
