Had I only looked sooner we may have shared some memories among ourselves.

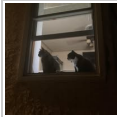

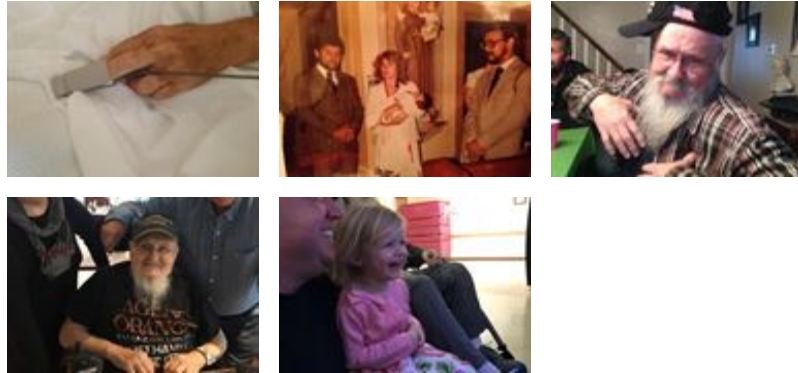
