“ Ken and I went through the Phila. Police Academy together (Class MPO 1) and I admired how he would often speak up when he held views contrary to others. Some in authority resented his outspokenness, but many others appreciated his honesty. Ken and I were on a plain clothes detail one night when we were jumped by 5 males. We compelled 4 of them to flee, and Ken was able to take the car driver into custody. Likewise, he positively identified another one of the suspects at a local hospital. Prosecution of the two males was quick (one accepted a plea deal, the other was found guilty in a jury trial). For his actions in this incident, he was awarded the Department's Medal of Valor.
